



Protective Factors: Knowledge of Parenting and Child Development

This session will be spent looking at the Knowledge of Parenting and Child Development Protective Factor. We will explore how family history, personality, information seeking, and culture influence parenting behavior. We will also identify actions to help support and strengthen parenting and integrate these concepts into your work. The Strengthening Families Protective Factors Framework is a national and international initiative that aims to develop and enhance five specific characteristics that help keep families strong and children safe from abuse and neglect. The center for the Study of Social Policy developed the framework with the funding from the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation.
