This session will be spent looking at the Social and Emotional Competence of Children Protective Factor. We will learn why social and emotional competence of children can help reduce the risk of child maltreatment. We will also explore the relationship between family functioning and social emotional competence of children, and we will identify ways to help parents develop strategies which support the healthy social and emotional growth of children.
